

Jail Capacity Impacted by Sewer Upgrades

DDF Has to close one floor at a time due to sewer system updates, costing the availability of approximately 200 jail beds in the downtown facility.

We lose approximately \$20,000 in federal revenue daily with a floor shut down.

Project due to be completed in August of 2025.

Daily Jail Census Report

From January to February, avg. counts changed from 2,493 to 2,498. From Feb. to March, avg. counts changed from 2,498 to 2,463 (-1.4%). 
From December to January the average count changed from 236 to 224 (-5%). From January to February the avg. count changed from 224 to 193. From February to March the avg. count changed from 193 to 190. From March to April, the average count changed from 190 to 138 (-28%). From April to May, the monthly average count changed from 138 to 63 (-54%). From May to June, the monthly average count changed from 63 to 61 (-3.3%). From June to July monthly counts changed from 61 to 93 (+52%). July to August monthly avg. counts changed from 93 to 100 (+7.8%).




Detailed Booking Offense Description

On September 1, 2020, Federal inmates accounted for over a quarter of all inmates in El Paso County's jail.





On September 1, 2024, Federal inmates accounted for only 3% of all inmates in El Paso County's jail.




^{*} The "OLS" inmate definition is limited to any inmate charged with Riot Participation or Smuggling of Persons..

Of the federal inmate slice that has been eaten up since 2020, about 54% of that slice has been taken up by OLS inmates, while about 46% of that slice has been taken up by non-OLS inmates.





An increase in State inmates—both OLS and non-OLS—has contributed to a substantial decrease in Felony inmates



Bookings 2012 to Aug. 2024 Although post-pandemic bookings have not increased to previous counts, inmate population counts have increased.



From 2012 to 2019, the average length of stay in jail pretrial was 24.1 days. From 2020-2023, that average increased by 39% to 33.5 days.


Competency Incarceration: Trending down recently, but significant increases since 2019





Competency Incarceration Trends: Outflow Has Increased in Recent Months, Trending Positively


2024 Incompetent Count Outflows: Inmates Transferred to State Facilities/Hospitals




Pretrial Condition Warrants for Violations






While the outgoing misdemeanor criminal cases disposed within 180 days since the pandemic, there is still a large gap towards reaching the 98% goal established by NCSC



72% of active pending felony cases are less than 360 days old as of Oct 1. As of Oct 1, at least 28% will not meet the NCIC standard when disposed. *OCA reporting guidelines match NCSC standards



63% of active pending misdemeanor cases are less than 180 days old as of Oct. 1. 37% of active pending misdemeanor cases are beyond the NCIC standard of 180 days. *OCA reporting guidelines match NCSC standards
