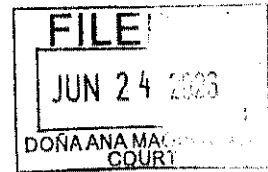

CRIMINAL COMPLAINT

Count 1: Knowingly Leaving the Scene of an Accident (Great Bodily Harm or Death) 66-7-201(A),(C), NMSA 1978

Count 2: Tampering with Evidence (Third or Fourth or Indeterminate Degree Felony) 30-22-5 (A), (B), NMSA 1978

The undersigned, under penalty of perjury, complains and says that on or about **June 22, 2026**, in the County of Dona Ana, State of New Mexico, the above-named defendant **Kimberly Ann Skaggs** did:

1. Knowingly Leaving the Scene of an Accident (Great Bodily Harm or Death)


On or about June 22, 2026, in Dona Ana County, New Mexico, the above-named defendant drove a motor vehicle involved in an accident resulting in the death of Andrew R Brown and knowingly failed to stop or immediately return to the scene of the accident to give required information and render reasonable assistance, a third-degree felony, contrary to NMSA 1978, §66-7-201(A), (C).

2. Tampering with Evidence (Third or Fourth or Indeterminate Degree Felony)

On or about June 22 2026. in Dona Ana County, New Mexico, the above-named defendant destroyed, changed, hid, fabricated, or placed Hid vehicle on vacant property at 5033 Northwind Las Cruces, NM 88007 with the intent to prevent the apprehension, prosecution or conviction of herself, and the highest crime was a third, fourth or indeterminate degree felony, a fourth-degree felony, contrary to NMSA 1978, §30-22-5 (A), (B).

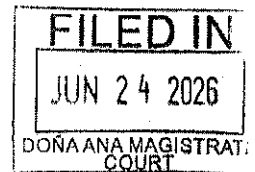

STATEMENT OF FACTS IN SUPPORT OF CRIMINAL COMPLAINT

AFFIANT BEING A FULL TIME SALARIED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER WITH THE DONA ANA COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT ACTING IN THE CAPACITY OF DETECTIVE HAS LEARNED THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

Affiant, being duly sworn, upon his oath, states that I have reason to believe that on the 23th day of June 2026, the following described home, cartilage, and property contains evidence of the crime associated with Knowingly Leaving the Scene of an Accident (Great Bodily Harm or Death) 66-7-201(A), (C) and Tampering with Evidence (Third or Fourth or Indeterminate Degree Felony) §30-22-5 (A), (B) which occurred in near the address of 850 N Fairacres Las Cruces, NM of Dona Ana County on the roadway.

Affiant, Traffic Deputy Fabian Fernandez, is a full-time salaried law enforcement officer who has been employed by the Dona Ana County Sheriff's Department for a period of approximately 17 Years. Affiant has received training in Basic Criminal investigations, in Crash investigation through the New Mexico Law Enforcement Academy, Completed Advanced collision Investigation training, Crash Reconstruction Investigation training, Vehicle vs Pedestrian investigation training, Motorcycle Crash investigation training, is certified to retrieve data from the Crash Data Retrieval System "DCR", and has been with the Crash Recon Team for approximately 14 years. Affiant is currently assigned to the Dona Ana County Traffic Division and has served in the division for 16 years. Affiant has conducted numerous crash investigations that led to the arrest and conviction of persons in violation of New Mexico State Statutes.

- On June 22, 2026, Officers with the Dona Ana County Sheriff's Department responded to a report of a Hit and Run Fatal Crash. Crash occurred on the roadway near the address of 850 N Fairacres Las Cruces, NM 88007. I arrived on scene at approximately 1446 hrs.

Upon my arrival I contacted Marina Enriquez and learned the following. She observed a female walking around the scene as she drove onto the scene. She advised she noticed the female was walking to her vehicle and leaving northbound on Fairacres Road. Mrs. Enriquez took photographs of the driver leaving the scene and of the crash scene. She provided those photos to via email to me. The photographs showed a newer black model Cadillac Escalade with a New Mexico support the troops license plate with the possible last digits of "54." She described the driver as a female with dark blonde hair. Hair length about shoulder length. Possibly a white person with average build.

- I learned the following while on scene. The victim identified himself as Andrew Brown date of birth October 10th, 1985. Victim was struck by a vehicle while riding his bicycle crossing the roadway. Vehicle was traveling north on Fairacres Rd. Andrew Brown was severely injured due to the crash and later succumbed to his injuries on the scene. Howard Cothorn from the Office of Medical Investigators responded and pronounced Andrew deceased at 1614 hrs. Andrew was identified through his tattoos and previous booking photos.
- Affiant learned from Deputy Bianca Paz DASO 1292 at the scene there was around 208 feet of skid marks. Debris from the suspect vehicle. Two small black plastic pieces with grill marks and GM imprinted on the back of them. Bicycle broken into several pieces on scene.
- Sgt. Nathan Jimerson provided a flock photo of a vehicle matching the description of the suspect vehicle traveling east on Picacho Ave. The time was 1443 hours, close to the time of the crash.
- Lt Joshua Sherman advised me he had located a citation issued by LCPD before with the vehicle license plate displaying US0954 and identifying the driver as Kimberly Ann Skaggs. Mrs. Skaggs was cited on 9-16-25 for Racing on Streets-Exhibition Driving. Her address was identified as 325 Sandy Beach Rd a short distance from the crash scene.
- Later I received a video from Sun City business off Picacho Ave. I observed in the video a black Cadillac Escalade matching the photo provided by the witness driving east and then turned north onto Burke Rd at a high rate of speed.
- I learned the following from Deputy Garcia. He obtained a subpoena to have On Star conduct a live GPS tracking of the vehicle. On Star advised it was at the address of 5033 Northwind Rd Las Cruces, NM 88007. I learned from Sgt. Jimerson who utilized the Dona Ana County Assessors Office to confirm the property was owned by Ms. Kimberly Skaggs.
- I overheard the following from a telephonic interview between Brenda Schubert and Sgt Jimerson. Mrs. Skaggs owns a Cadillac Escalade and is the only one who drives it. She attempted to call Mrs. Skaggs, and the phone went straight to voice mail. She advised it was odd behavior to have her cell phone off.
- On June 23rd 2026 at approximately 1841 hrs a search warrant of the property to retrieve the Black Cadillac Escalade bearing New Mexico Plate US0954 was executed. Fresh tire impression were observed on the dirt that lead directly to the Black Cadillac Escalade. No other fresh tire impressions were observed leading to the black Cadillac Escalade.

Vehicle was located on the southwest part of the property behind the residence under a red metal carport facing south.

- While on scene on the outer exterior of the vehicle I observed damage to front lower bumper area below the grill. I observed blood splatter under the right side step near the right front wheel well. A small tire tread pattern was also observed on the front bumper area consistent with a bicycle tire. There was also fresh scrapes and scratches on the lower front bumper area. Two missing peaces from the lower front bumper area were missing consistent with pieces left at the scene of the crash. Right front tire was flat and had green substance splatter near the inflation valve consistent with fix a flat.

I swear or affirm under penalty of perjury that the facts set forth above are true to the best of my information and belief. I understand that it is a criminal offense subject to the penalty of imprisonment to make a false statement in a criminal complaint.
